



# Unsheltered Homelessness Six Point Plan

<p><b>1</b></p>	<p><b>Safe Camping</b>          Location: Railyards          100 tents</p> 	<p>A low-barrier-to-entry site prioritizing people experiencing unsheltered homelessness in the River District. The City will provide tents, restrooms, showers, trash collection, charging stations, outreach staff &amp; security. Dogs &amp; 2 large bins of belongings allowed.</p> <p>Target opening date: April 2026</p>
<p><b>2</b></p>	<p><b>Safe Parking</b>          Location: South Sacramento          60-80 vehicles</p>	<p>A low-barrier-to-entry site where people can park &amp; sleep in their vehicles safely. The City will provide restrooms, trash collection, charging stations, outreach staff &amp; security. Vehicles must be registered and operational.</p>  <p>Target opening date: TBD</p>
<p><b>3</b></p>	<p><b>Micro-communities</b>          Location: Natomas &amp; South Sacramento          3 communities, 120 residents</p>	<p>Three City-funded senior communities of 40 tiny homes, 120 sq ft each. The City will provide electricity, heating/AC, WiFi, refrigerators/freezers &amp; microwaves, shared bathrooms, showers, laundry, gardens, dog runs &amp; gathering spaces. After a 90-day grace period, residents can choose to stay and pay 30% of their income.</p>  <p>Target construction date: April 2026</p>
<p><b>4</b></p>	<p><b>Homekey+ Tiny Homes</b>          Location: North &amp; South Sacramento          2 communities, 225 residents</p>	<p>The City is applying for a State grant for a new model of permanent supportive housing using tiny homes for seniors and veterans. More cost-effective, more community; combines subsidized housing &amp; on-site supportive services. Pending State funding approval.</p>  <p>Target construction date: TBD</p>
<p><b>5</b></p>	<p><b>Motel Program 2.0</b>          90 new residents, increased from 600</p> 	<p>A recent audit found the Motel Program is not cost-effective &amp; had a low rate of successful exits into permanent housing. We are converting the Program to voucher-based (currently, the City pays motels directly) and increasing resident engagement with services. Projected cost savings: \$2M.</p> <p>Target date: In Progress</p>
<p><b>6</b></p>	<p><b>Robin Moore Tiny Home Grant Program</b></p>	<p>The Mayor's Office is developing a Tiny Homes Grant Program to partner with organizations and businesses. We will provide interested faith-based organizations, non-profits &amp; homeowners with tiny homes, funded through sponsorships, for homeless residents.</p>  <p>Target date: In Progress</p>

**Last year, we added 500 new beds. If the Six Point Plan is successful, we will add an additional 625+ places for unsheltered Sacramentans, bringing the total to 1,125 new spaces.**
